Purpose

The Richland County Park District internship offers an immersive experience in the day-to-day operations of a county park district. The intern will work closely with the education director and staff to achieve the educational goals set by the park district. There will be opportunities to participate in indoor and outdoor activities related to natural history programming, animal care, natural resources management, and administrative duties. The intern will also work alongside park district staff, volunteers, and other interns.

Duties and Responsibilities

- Assist with and conduct natural history and environmental education programs.
- Care for educational and display animals, including helping with weekly public feeding days.
- Handle amphibians and reptiles, including snakes, and allow people to interact with them.
- Co-lead a group of children during a week-long day camp.
- Prepare materials needed for lessons and activities; plan new lessons/programs if interested.
- Interact with the general public: answer phones, welcome visitors, and interpret nature center information.
- Maintain our new native butterfly house and supervise visitors in it.
- May occasionally assist with natural resources projects as needed, such as trail maintenance, landscaping, and pulling invasive species.
- Perform other duties as assigned.

 - Preferred: Background in natural sciences and/or education, experience working with children and animals, experience working outdoors in natural settings.
